





#### ANALYSIS & INTERPRETATION

The student feedback analysis reveals generally positive perceptions across the course, department, and college, with room for improvement in specific areas. The course content received a strong overall rating (4.16/5), but aspects like employability enhancement (3.71/5) and real-life applicability (3.59/5) suggest potential refinements. The department was well-rated, particularly in teachers' knowledge and communication skills (4.51/5) and the Head of Department's supportive approach (4.33/5). However, the use of modern teaching aids (3.34/5) could be improved. College facilities varied in evaluation; while the principal's approachability was praised (4.03/5), the conditions of toilets (2.47/5) and the canteen (2.81/5) were notably low-rated, indicating urgent areas for improvement. The overall college rating of 3.79/5 suggests a generally satisfactory experience but highlights key areas requiring attention.

First the IQAC Coordinator Dr. Debasis Mohanty request Principal Dr. Purna Chandra Baral to preside over the meeting. In the outset Dr. Purna Chandra Baral, Chairman IQAC welcome the members. Dr. Debasis Mohanty, IQAC Coordinator read out the minutes of previous IQAC meeting which was held on 23.12.2023 and it was approved. Then, Dr. Mohanty placed the agenda of the meeting before the members. Discussion was made as per the agenda and following resolutions were made.

- 1- The feedback taken from students, Faculty, other employees, Alumni along with analysis were placed before the committee. After discussion, it is resolved that on basis of the analysis, a report to be submitted to the College Administration for action taken.
- 2- The AQAR prepared for 2022-23 session was placed before the committee and it was approved.
- 3- As per the decision of the 1<sup>st</sup> IQAC meeting, Academic Audit for the session 2022-23 on OSHEC module was done by the IQAC Team. On the basis of the Academic audit report, it was found that there is a huge gap between departments. Some dept. scored very excellently with 17314 points while some dept. scored very poorly with 8330 points. So, after discussion the committee suggested that the IQAC Cell will guide & motivate the low performing Dept. to increase their academic activities, so that the gap between various departments will decrease in the next session.
- 4- As per the previous resolution, the IQAC motivated faculties to apply for research project. On the initiative of the IQAC Cell, five no. of faculties have applied for MRI Research project sponsored by Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Odisha. Out of which two faculties have selected for project.
- 5- As per the IQAC action plan, IQAC in Collaboration with staff club felicitated the faculties who has got project, awarded PhD or published research paper in this the session.
- 6- The Green, Energy, Environment & Gender audit report for the session 2022-23 was placed before the committee and it was approved.
